Berrybush is a unique cabin filled with rustic charm and is one of the oldest buildings in Paradise Falls. It is one of the 3 original barns on PF property and was converted to a cabin over 80 years ago. Many of the original fixtures still exist. The original 8x8 barn beams and barn board are visible in most of the cabin, and even though it is insulated with 3 zone LP hot water heat, and an updated electric system with 150 amp service, it has never been a house, it is definitely a cabin.

For our family and friends, the dining room on the first floor has always been the most popular room in the cabin and the gathering place for many large family breakfasts, cards and board games. The pellet stove keeps it warm and cozy in the winter months, and in the summer the room stays cool and comfortable. Because of the many trees on the property, the temperature inside stays temperate, but if you prefer it cooler, there is an AC unit in the living room capable of cooling the entire mid-floor, which consists of the living room, 3 bedrooms and 2 full bathrooms. There are also many built-in bookcases and several replacement (Anderson)windows and because of the unique construction, many of the walls are non-supported and could be easily moved.

My very favorite part of Berrybush has always been the attic. Just open the hatch to the most barn-like part of the cabin, which has been the best place to hang out on rainy days at PF. There is ample space for storage

and lots of room to expand. Presently, it contains a full bathroom with an extra long tub on legs, 2 bedrooms and a loft, and the attic is where the original exposed notched and pegged beams in the barn are most visible. In the fall and winter months, there is a great view of the lake from the back window. At present the attic also houses a large Lionel train lay-out.

The entrance to Berrybush is on RT 191 and there is a driveway that leads to Beach Rd, and its a short walk to the beach. The backyard has hosted many fun gatherings and picnics, where we have enjoyed evenings around the campfire telling PF tales. Due

to health issues, it hasn't been as easy for us to make the 6 hr drive for upkeep, maintenance or even to spend much time there. Its time to let go of an old friend.

We are asking \$72,000.00, negotiable on what items/furniture etc remain. We could include gardening tools, kitchen supplies and furniture items. The 500 gallon LP gas tank is owned by us and is included. Please contact Steve Dierolf 412-780-9188 if interested or with any questions.


