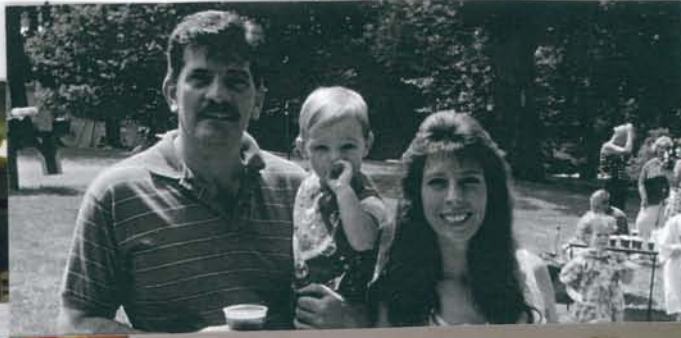

The Women's Auxiliary 1929-1972

by Ruth Haase and Louise Shetlock

Early in the history of PFLA a need was felt for a women's group to help in developing fellowship among cottagers and in raising money for special projects and general support of the whole enterprise.

The Women's Auxiliary was formed in 1929. Since then it has provided a continuous flow of money to all sorts of projects and has provided many fellowship functions.

The minutes of the Women's Auxiliary is most interesting reading. It gives a detailed account of many meetings. It tells of hosts of events which were used to raise money. We read about lawn fetes and garden parties, bazaars, bingo parties, progressive luncheons, and koffee klutches. There were fashion shows, covered dish suppers, apron shows, bake sales, band concerts, auctions, parcel post sales, food sales, talent shows, dessert socials, theatre parties, benefit suppers and white elephant sales.

Nestledown was one of the earliest recipients of help from the auxiliary. In 1932 Nestledown lobby was repainted and refurnished.

A soda fountain was installed in Gate Lodge in 1933.

Ecclesiastical furniture was provided in 1934.

The old swimming pool was improved in 1937 through the auxiliary.

In 1947 a filmstrip projector, a record player and two large horns were purchased for the recreation program.

From 1953 on Lake Crawford was improved by efforts of the Auxiliary. The same year playground equipment was added and the tennis courts improved. The auxiliary began an enlarged gift shop operation in 1954. *and lasting till 1967*

Following the damage to Lake Crawford caused by the hurricanes of 1955 the auxiliary aided in repairing the dam, repairing the stairs to the Falls, and draining and cleaning Lake Crawford.

In 1960 a retaining wall on the beach was paid for by the auxiliary.

A beautiful new adult lounge was erected in 1968. It was furnished by the auxiliary and a large portion of the building costs also paid for by the auxiliary.

Upkeep and management has been the responsibility of this group of active women.

As early as 1931 a gift shop was in operation. Miss Bertha Heid enlisted volunteers to man it in the tea room. The full story of the gift shop appears elsewhere in this book.

The auxiliary has supplied the altar flowers for the church services for many years. Road improvements including asphaltting around "The Center", were provided, also many shrubs and trees to make our entrance more inviting.

Old timers will remember gratefully the excellent concerts and lectures arranged by the auxiliary and Mrs. Bertha Crawford. Beginning in 1942 we enjoyed Miss Pina La Corte, soprano and Marcella Decray, harpist, in annual concerts. In addition the auxiliary sponsored Jack Irwin in a Sacred concert, numerous band concerts, a Barber Shop Quartet and the world renowned bird photographer, Edward A. Hill.

The auxiliary has hosted special parties for visiting church dignitaries including German Bishop Hans Lilje, and Bishop Rajah Manikam of India. It also sponsored an open house on the occasion of Adolph and Mae Klein's 50th Wedding Anniversary.

Recently the adult lounge has been the site of demonstrations of adult hobbies such as dried flower arrangements, making burlap flowers, stained glass ornaments.

The Women's Auxiliary

1972-1997

Since its inception in 1929, the Women's Auxiliary has funded a variety of projects within Paradise Falls Lutheran Association and provided many opportunities for fellowship activities.

Nestledown was one of the earliest recipients of the auxiliary's efforts with the repainting and refurnishing of its lobby in 1932. Throughout the 1930s and into the '50s, additional projects were accomplished including: a soda fountain in Gate Lodge; Ecclesiastical furniture; improvements to the old swimming pool; purchase of a filmstrip projector and record player for the recreation program; playground equipment; and improvements to the tennis courts.

Some of the money necessary for the completion of Lake Crawford was raised by the auxiliary, and after the flood of 1955, the group aided in making repairs to the dam, the stairs to the Falls and draining and cleaning of the lake. The retaining wall at the beach was built by the auxiliary in 1960 and the adult lounge was furnished by the group, which also provided a large portion of the building costs.

1972-1997 In recent years, the auxiliary's mandate has been to support the ongoing projects of the association through various fundraising efforts including one of the most popular - the annual breakfast.

The Women's Auxiliary would like to thank all those who have contributed their time and efforts over the years to provide a continued fellowship for all PFLA members.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE:

The President reported that Mrs. Borg has accepted the chairmanship of this committee, and the names of several new members have been turned over to the Treasurer.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:

It was reported that since our last regular meeting the Manager had met with the Committee and discussed the matter of the folding chairs for Social Hall. It was found that the wholesale cost of a really good chair was \$4.75 - this chair retails for \$7.95. As prices are steadily rising and as steel chairs may not be procurable next year, the Executive Committee authorized the purchase at this time of 200 chairs, to be paid for by the Auxiliary this year and next, as funds become available. 60 of these chairs are already in use and have ~~received most favorable comment~~ been most favorably received. received most favorable comment.

SUMMER PROGRAM OF ENTERTAINMENT:

1. July 12 (Wednesday) THE PROGRESSIVE LUNCHEON, 12:00 hours.

As already reported by the Treasurer, tickets in the amount of

\$126.00 were sold. The net profit will be well over \$100.00. Including children, approximately 132 persons were served. For future guidance there is appended to these Minutes a list of the foods bought and donated, with an approximate cost of the latter.

Mrs. Wilde reported on the Household Paper demonstration which followed the Progressive Luncheon that she had to date received

2. July 21 (Friday) AFTERNOON CARD PARTY on the Shetlock grounds.

The Chair reported that Mr. Haboush had been communicated with but his ~~reply~~ acceptance having been received too late for us to give his lecture sufficient publicity, it was called off. In its place a card party was held that afternoon on the porch and lawns of the Shetlock Cottage. Voluntary donations were received, which netted \$32.00. It proved to be a most enjoyable affair, and a vote of thanks was extended to Mrs. Shetlock for arranging and taking charge, as well as for the use of her grounds.

3. August 5th (Saturday) LECTURE of Mr. HILL ON "INTERPRETATIONS OF NATURE".

Mrs. Crawford reported that to date she had secured 111 patrons @ \$1.50 each. The tickets, \$1.00 for adults, 50¢ for children, had been turned over to Mrs. Shetlock. Mrs. Shetlock and Mrs. Moyer have been asked to take the tickets at the door. Mrs. Wilde was asked to take charge of decorations, and authorized to purchase three dozen gladiolas.

4. August 11th (Friday) COVERED DISH SUPPER for Cottagers. 6:00 P.M.

The Cottagers will be asked to bring their own dishes/for the supper. Plans for this are moving forward. Mrs. Haag was appointed to take charge of setting up the tables. The Chef will be asked to make the coffee. Mrs. Ammon and Mrs. Voit will make the iced tea. The meat course will be provided by Mmes. Shetlock, Ries, Voit, Ammon and Dittmer, and will be prepared at the Shetlock cottage.

It is proposed that the Supper be followed at 8:00 P.M. by a card Party for cottagers and guests, with dancing in the center of the Hall. Mrs. Voit has purchased a record book of waltzes for the dancing. Three or four prizes will be offered, and and table settings

bring their own dishes/for the supper.

these will be drawn for. A donation will be asked. It was proposed that a mimeographed insert, advertising this event, be placed in the next issue of the SPRAY.

5. August 18th (Friday) APRON FASHION SHOW on the Dittmer lawns. 2 P.M.

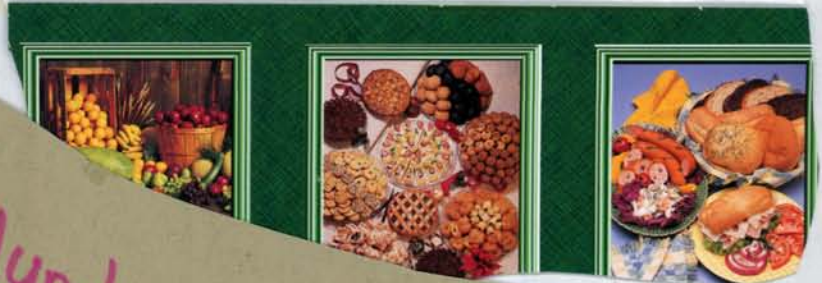
